REPORTS OF OFFICERS

PRESIDENT IACULLO

President Iacullo underscored the importance of the recent Invitational Tournament and the income generated from the event , as well as the income generated from other RMGC activities. He proposed a fact-finding committee to examine all of the events and activities sponsored by RMGC; an active discussion of ideas for the review process ensued. The Home and Away Committee and the Tournament Committee will form a joint discussion group. The idea of a gender free Invitational was discussed. Iacullo proposed that reports should be discussed at the August meeting.

PRESIDENT ELECT/TOURNAMENT ATKINS/SNYDER

Atkins characterized the Par 3 Tournament as a success; 104 golfers participated and \$620 in prize money was awarded.

The stroke play Tournament, scheduled for mid-June/ had 24 players signed-up as of this dates. Most players elected to use the white tees.

Mr. Fuller noted that the Rossmore News is limiting pictures on the sports page to group pictures (All winners in a single photo). The News has a new editor who may not be aware of the many activities offered by RMGC, as well as the importance of press coverage. Snyder suggested inviting her to a meeting. Following some discussion it was decided that Meng will invite her to lunch and will be joined by President Iacullo.

INVITATIONAL CLARE

Chuck Clare made a very positive report regarding the recent Invitational Tournament. He noted there were 88 players including 4 flight sponsors. Nine (9) players participated in the Calloway Scoring model. He commented that the tournament prizes and putting contests were both successful. Estimated income for the event is \$15,800 with expenses of about \$14,300 for a total profit of \$1500.

Clare thanked Atkins and Burnett for their contributions and noted that Mark Heptig had been very helpful and accommodating throughout the event. He reported that sponsors were generally pleased and positive about the Tournament, and President Iacullo echoed that sentiment.
